6.8	Oversight Agreement with the Department of Education (2020/2022) On March 15th, 2023, the Executive met with the Department of Education in accordance with the three-year Oversight Agreement (OA) and annual Performance Delivery Agreement (PDA) between Kerry ETB and the Department. The agenda for the meeting included an appraisal of the submitted Service Plan 2022 and Annual Report 2021, as well as a discussion of key governance matters, such as financial governance, arising from the OA and PDA.
	The meeting was positive, with good input from both sides. Topics covered by the ETB included the 2022 return to a "post-COVID-19 normality" and the ongoing response to meet the education and training needs of the Ukrainian community in Kerry. Other items addressed included ESBS, capital projects, development of the Strategy Statement 2023-2027, and Irish Language and Communication Officer roles.
	The Department enquired about live Kerry ETB projects referenced in the Service Plan 2022 and Annual Report 2021, including the centralised procurement and purchasing model, child protection process/monitoring visits, board meetings and attendance, board self-assessment, and property. Regarding the board self-assessment evaluation report, the DE was advised that Governance Ireland conducted the self-assessment, and the report was positive. It was agreed to send a copy of the report to the Department.
	The next iteration (2023-2025) of the Oversight and Performance Delivery Agreements have been signed by Kerry ETB, and the organisation received the Department signed copies on March 22nd, 2023.
	This update was welcomed.

6.9	Dr Noel Kissane 'Kerry From Maps and Chart,' Sponsorship Request Board Members noted the receipt of a sponsorship request from Dr Noel Kissane towards the publication of his book, "Kerry From Maps and Chart". In addressing this request, the Board acknowledged the importance of supporting the cultural and historical development of the Kerry community but emphasised that it must align with the organisation's core objectives and activities. After discussing the matter, the Board agreed that funding for such projects falls outside the scope of the ETB's publically-funded core activities. Therefore, it was determined that the request should be respectfully referred back to the individual with the possible recommendation to explore funding support from other relevant agencies. This was unanimously agreed.

	In addition, the Director of SY&M, Ms Ann O'Dwyer, provided an update on the Two Mile Community National School Preschool Service.
	Two Mile Community National School Preschool Service At the February 2023 Board meeting, the Board was advised that discussions were ongoing with the approved third-party provider for the provision of a preschool on the Two Mile Community National School (CNS) site from September 2023.
	Orchard House Limited was identified as the successful provider to install the prefabricated accommodation on the site following an expression of interest process in 2022.
	In his March 2023 report to the Board, the Buildings Officer set out that he and his colleagues, including the Two Mile CNS Principal, Ms Catherine Barry, met with Orchard House Limited on February 28 th , 2023, to discuss the project, particularly to address progress regarding the provision of the preschool on the school's site. Following this meeting, Kerry ETB was notified by email on March 14th, 2023, that the preschool provider would not be in a position to complete the installation on the school's site due to ongoing recruitment issues as well as the increase in building costs. The school management was updated regarding this decision.
	In addition, in addressing matters from the February 2023 Board meeting, the CCT Department reviewed the prefabricated accommodation across the ETB's estate. It was confirmed that no unit of sufficient size is available to transfer to Two Mile CNS.
	The Director of SY&M confirmed that Kerry ETB had explored and exhausted all potential options. Consequently, it has been agreed with the principal and school BOM chairperson that there will be no preschool facility on the school site. The Director of SY&M is engaging with the school principal and BOM chairperson to agree on a statement to parents confirming this outcome.
	The Board thanked the Director of SY&M for her updates.

	 NPWS commitment to the continuation of the schools' programme and resourcing of same. Kerry ETB to support the NPWS in the transition to the move to direct delivery of education services for schools by the NPWS. NPWS agreed to continue to provide full access for Kerry ETB (Kerry College) to the Killarney National Park as required for the Ecology course. A joint communication is to be drafted, agreed, and jointly issued to all stakeholders addressing the transition of the provision of the schools' programme to direct provision by the NPWS.

This update was welcomed by all in attendance.
The Board also noted recent media coverage regarding the design and assignment of toilet blocks in the school. The Director of SY&M, Ms Ann O'Dwyer, advised that she has engaged with the school principal in relation to this matter, confirming that the decision regarding the assignment of toilet blocks was based on creating an inclusive environment for all students. The toilet blocks are designed to promote safety and privacy and to prevent bullying. The school principal is responding to queries on this matter from parents and the local and national media.
The Building Officer further advised that the design team, in consultation with the ETB and the school, followed the School Design Guide 02-06 Sanitary Facilities issued in November 2021.
Board Members requested that a letter of support be issued to the local school management congratulating them on completing the new modern building and fully supporting the decision to assign toilet blocks based on an inclusive approach. The CEO agreed to issue the letter.
Board Members were reminded that the April ETB Board meeting would be held in the new school building on April 25th, 2023.
Kerry College Killarney Campus Building Project (Matters Arising Section
<u>4.8</u>) On March 6th, 2023, Kerry ETB received notification from SOLAS of the upcoming workshops with ETBs setting out the process for preparing the Preliminary Business Case (Decision Gate 1 appraisal). The workshop, which was held on March 28 th in Dublin, was attended by the Director of FET and the Head of CCT, who provided positive feedback from the event.
A further update will be provided at the next meeting.
<u>Scamps and Scholars Lease (Matters Arising Section 4.9)</u> As previously reported at recent Board meetings, Kerry ETB is still awaiting the signed lease from Scamps and Scholars (Killorglin Community Childcare) before it can sign and seal the lease.
In addressing this matter, it was agreed that the Head of CCT, Ms Aileen O'Connor, would engage with the respective legal agents to ensure that the

third party signs the lease so that it can be signed and sealed by Kerry ETB at the upcoming April 2023 Board meeting.
The Board noted its agreement with this process as set out.
Proposed Purchase of House and Lands in Listowel Board Members were advised that Ger Carmody Auctioneers has been in contact with the landowner to reach an agreement in principle for the purchase of the property as per the requirements of the DoE correspondence with Kerry ETB. Kerry ETB received email correspondence from Ger Carmody on February 3rd, 15th and 17th, 2023, indicating that negotiations are ongoing with the landowner.
On March 1 st , 2023, Kerry ETB received a copy of a valuation undertaken by the property owner, valuing the property at €395,000. Kerry ETB met with Ger Carmody on the same day to discuss same.
Mr Carmody has informed Kerry ETB that the landowner is unwilling to accept an offer within the independent valuations received by Kerry ETB. It was noted that the property has been independently valued twice by Kerry ETB, with valuations of €275,000 (in 2022) and €300,000 (in 2019).
Ger Carmody continues to engage with the landowner and will update Kerry ETB accordingly. Due to the protracted nature of these matters, the Board agreed that negotiations with the landowner need to be concluded for April 7th, 2023. Mr Carmody will be advised to inform the landowner that the ETB wishes to conclude negotiations by Friday, April 7th, 2023. After April 7th, Kerry ETB will update the Department on the outcome of the negotiation process.
The need to progress this building project was emphasised, and it was agreed that if it is not possible to purchase the property, plans for the adjustment of the development site will be made.
It was noted that approval from both the Board and the Department is required for any purchase.

Blended Working Policy Update

The November 2022 Board meeting featured a detailed discussion around remote working and the most effective approaches for Kerry ETB to adopt in relation to same. During the meeting, the Executive expressed its support for introducing remote/hybrid/blended working arrangements for staff, referencing that the National Remote Work Strategy aims for the public sector to achieve a target of 20% offsite work (extract from minutes included below).

- Kerry ETB is supportive of remote/hybrid arrangements.
- Support for the ETB establishing remote working hubs/ offices in key locations across the county.
- Possibility of the ETB staff utilising the current network of remote working hubs in County Kerry, for example, Hubs Network established in Baile na Sceilg, Sneem, Listowel, Kenmare, Listowel Castleisland, Dingle etc.
- Possible use of the ETB's current building estate across the county as remote working hubs/office locations.
- The importance for the ETB to act in the interest of sustainability and reduce its carbon footprint.
- The potential for remote working hubs/offices to increase the appeal of the ETB as an employer to potential job applicants across the county.
- The potential advantage of local ETB hubs/offices for the public seeking to access services of the ETB locally.

Since the meeting, the Executive has evaluated several approaches to blended working and engaged with staff and relevant unions in relation to same.

As set out in the circulated CEO's report, a meeting was held with head office staff on March 24th, 2023, to discuss blended working and related approaches. The meeting was highly constructive and generated valuable insights from staff.

At the facilitated session, a survey was conducted with head office staff present to determine their interest in moving to blended working arrangements across head office. The results from the survey were presented to the Board as follows:

- Not interested in blended working: 36%
- Interested in blended working 20% of the time: 34%
- Interested in blended working 50% of the time: 23%
- Interested in remote working from a hub 80% of the time: 7%

The Director of OS&D, Ms Maria Brennan, advised that a working group has been established with head office staff to develop the Blended Working Policy in line with the "Blended Working Policy Framework for Civil Service Organisations" developed by the Department of Public Expenditure

and Reform. It is hoped to finalise the policy and run a pilot for a period of six months, commencing in June 2023.
In the following discussion, An Cathaoirleach advised the Executive to exercise caution and ensure that the office spaces are not left vacant after moving to blended working arrangements. It was also emphasised that the public services offered by the ETB must continue to be provided with the highest standards of customer service.
Further updates will be provided at the April 2023 Board meeting.
<u>Moyderwell Mercy Primary School Additional Accommodation</u> The CEO advised receipt of correspondence dated March 24 th 2023, from the Principal of Moyderwell Mercy Primary School, Mr Pat Neenan, regarding its need for additional accommodation during planned building works at the primary school's site. As previously advised, Moyderwell Mercy Primary School has requested that the ETB consider the provision of classrooms in the "old" Gaelcholáiste Chiarraí school building to the primary school during its building works <i>(ref: January 2023 Board meeting minutes).</i>
In its correspondence dated March 24th, 2023, Moyderwell Mercy Primary School clarified that it would require from Kerry ETB:
 Two mainstream classrooms One classroom One smaller room
This request was positively received. In was agreed to engage with the DoE to buildings unit to discuss this matter. It was also noted that any potential arrangement to accommodate this request would have annually given the future possible used of the building by the ETB.
