There has been no further update since this meeting from Kerry County Council re same.</li> <li>Confirmation received from Murphy Ramsey Walsh Solicitors confirming the registration of the site title in the name of Kerry ETB on May 7<sup>th</sup> 2019.</li> <li>A letter issued to Kerry County Council on May 9<sup>th</sup> 2019 acknowledging their assistance with the accelerated site transfer to Kerry ETB.</li> <li>The site enabling works proceeding to schedule as per site meeting May 15<sup>th</sup> 2019.</li> <li>Works to commence by the Design Team on the next stage of the process i.e. preparation of documentation for the procurement of the contractor for the New School Building, Stage 2B (Detailed Design Tender Production). Awaiting formal DoES approval.</li> <li>The Board welcomed this update and in particular the granting of the planning permission for the new Gaelcholáiste. The Capital and Buildings Officer outlined the revised timeline for the completion of the project.</li> <li>The Board was also advised that the Design Team have reported more rock in the eastern area of the site (next to the hospital boundary wall). Currently this is being assessed by the Design Team and may lead to the development of a Change Order. Draft program of work reviewed and outstanding matters discussed.</li> <li>Kerry ETB to progress next stages with DoES and Oppermann Associates.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>The Capital and Buildings Officer provided an update regarding the revised timeline for the project. Based on the current timeline the Design Team have advised the school is to be fully built and completed by 2022. This has been communicated to the Principal and the BOM of Listellick National School at their meeting which took place on May 27<sup>th</sup> 2019 in Kerry ETB's offices. 	It was noted that a meeting had taken place earlier in the day which was attended by the Finance Officer for Kerry ETB and staff of KDYS re the outstanding matters. The Finance Officer indicated that the main matter remaining unresolved from Kerry ETB's perspective relates to the staff overpayment issue. Kerry ETB has offered again to enter into mediation or binding arbitration with KDYS in relation to this matter. KDYS was represented at the meeting by the Chief Financial Officer, Rose O'Connor and she indicated that she would be bringing the outcome of the meeting back to the Board of KDYS for consideration.
	Also, it was noted in relation to the claim by KDYS for additional costs arising from the transfer process that this currently lies with the DoES and Kerry ETB have received no further update in relation to same. Mr. Joe Brennan raised the matter of the private pension scheme operated by KDYS for some of the staff prior to the move to direct delivery of the programme by Kerry ETB and the unhappiness of some staff in how this is currently being addressed by KDYS. The CEO in responding to same made it clear that the matter of the pension between KDYS and their former employees and Kerry ETB have no involvement in same.
	The Board noted the update.

	As set out above, the Expression of Interest Form has been submitted and the estimated overall cost of the proposed development was €893,000. It was emphasised that Kerry ETB's proposed contribution is the land (under license or lease subject to DoES approval).
	On May 30 <sup>th</sup> 2019 there was a meeting with Murphy Ramsey Walsh Solicitors addressing the legal relationship between Kerry ETB and Killorglin Sports Complex. From initial discussions, it has been agreed to carry out a detailed review of the file with a view to setting out the formal legal relationship that exists for the current lease. The CEO indicated that these matters would be addressed over the summer months.

	The report was circulated to the Board and it was noted that an application has been made to the DoES regarding the prefunding, under the SLA, for the Gaelcholáiste Chiarraí project and which will assist with cash flow management.
	The Finance Officer also indicated that there is an improved financial position for Cappanalea OETC with the deficit currently standing at $\notin$ 13,000 and that work is underway, as referenced earlier with the MOU with UCC and other initiatives with a view to enhancing the finances of the centres income strands.
	It was noted that the overdraft is in place but has not had to be used.

	Cllr. Niall Kelleher queried as to why the other applicant's expression of interest was deemed invalid? The Head of CS&CD advised that the

documentation being sought to qualify for the Expression of Interest was quite comprehensive and that the unsuccessful applicant had failed to furnish the ETB with all the required documentation.
Mr. Noel Keenan indicated that in his view Dr. Crokes were a long and well established GAA club and in his view, they would not enter into an initiative like this unless they had the necessary financial resources to put to the project.
It was advised, that based on estimates, that this proposed development, should it proceed, would cost in the region of $\notin$ 750,000.
The CEO advised that this proposal is only in the early stages of discussions and that should this progress any further, there would need to be DoES approval. Due diligence for this proposal would require a full and comprehensive financial review of the finances for the project.
The Board were supportive of this proposal as it has the approval of the school BOM and would be a very beneficial development for the entire school community.
