Following the conclusion of the update, there was a lengthy discussion with the Board Members regarding the possible options for FET Capital Projects for less than  $\notin$ 5m and for Capital Projects over  $\notin$ 5m across the county. It was noted that these projects need to be prioritised and listed accordingly and submitted to SOLAS by March 25<sup>th</sup> 2022.

The CEO and the Director of FET advised that an update on the applications to be submitted would be provided at the next Board Meeting.

In relation to the proposal for the marine training centre in Caherciveen, Cllr. Norma Moriarty asked the Director of FET to liaise with Mr. Brian Hickey and Mr. David Doyle regarding the greenway and the development of the marine training centre.

In relation to the South Campus, it was noted that the CEO and An Cathaoirleach would try and follow up with the Minister in relation to same.

The need to establish a Section 44 Buildings Committee due to the ever-expanding volume and nature of the Capital and Buildings work of the ETB was discussed and noted (see 6.10).

There was a lengthy discussion regarding the Coláiste Gleann Lí extension and a proposal to build additional classrooms for Gleann Lí. It was noted that there are two buildings on Clash Road, the school is currently in the 1984 building with
Kerry College, Clash Campus currently using the 1974 building. It was noted that
the preference to be explored would be the actual return of the 1974 building on
Clash Road to the school, with the existing FET provision in the 1974 building
moving into the South Campus.

Based on an analysis of historic expenditure we are projecting a deficit of c. €30k overall for the Community National Schools. This has been highlighted to the Department of Education and we are in ongoing discussions re same.

### **Further Education and Training Grants**

The Funding Allocation Request (FAR 4) has been submitted to SOLAS seeking €42,033,805 in operational funding (final figure for 2021 was €38,028,344).

- ➢ Head of Finance noted that the SOLAS funding, similar to previous years, requires approval from the Board of SOLAS. This approval is normally received in Q2 of the Financial Year.
- > The FET Budget covers all operational costs associated with FET.
- It includes costs such as Wages, Rent, Overheads Apprenticeships, Courses for Employment and Courses for Progression, Adult Literacy, BTEI, Community Education, Youthreach, VTOS.
- Similar to previous years a mid-year review process will be undertaken in June and a further review in October.
- > The FAR 4 Bid will have to be approved by the Board of SOLAS.

### **Youth Services Grants**

Funding provided by the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth (DCEDIY) which funds youth work and youth-related activities.

- The majority of funding is provided by DCEDIY to Kerry ETB for onward distribution (under Grantor/Grantee arrangements) to Youth Services Organisations throughout the County.
- At the date of writing Kerry ETB have received written confirmation from DCEDIY that for 2022 funding of €1,080,648 will be available.
- As the year progresses it is likely that additional funding will become available to ETBs through application processes. Kerry ETB Youth Work Function will apply for these additional funding streams as they become available.

## **Capital Funding**

- > Department of Education and SOLAS Capital Projects are fully funded.
- In 2021 there was €18,788,360 received in Capital Funding and there was €8,503,709 in Capital Expenditure.
- There was a significant surplus in Capital receipts in 2021 which has carried forward into 2022.
- We are projecting receipts of €9,627,023 in 2022 and expenditure of €19,913,643 with the carry forward from 2021 funding the difference.
- These timing differences between cash inflows and outflows are a feature of Capital projects.
- It is likely as the year progresses that the Department of Education will sanction additional Capital projects.

### Summary

The Service Plan is compiled based on funding we know has been allocated in the case of Schools, Head Office, Youth Work and Capital. While these figures may increase as the year progresses the figures used in the Service Plan are the minimum that will be made available to Kerry ETB.

	<ul> <li>&gt; The FET FAR 4 bid of €42,033,805 will require formal approval from SOLAS which is expected in April/May. This would be similar to previous years. The FAR 4 bid is based on detailed analysis of the projected service provision for 2022.</li> <li>&gt; It is important to note that while the 2022 figures in isolation show a shortfall of c. €10.575m this does not take account of the significant balances (including over €10m in Capital Balances) that have been carried forward. When the opening cash position, including capital receipts in excess of €10million, is factored in there is sufficient funding to meet all projected expenditure.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Finance Committee</li> <li>The Kerry ETB Finance Committee reviewed the Service Plan Financials on 17<sup>th</sup></li> <li>February 2022 and were satisfied with same whilst noting the following:</li> <li>It was acknowledged that the projected expenditure for the Community National Schools exceeded the projected receipts and that Kerry ETB were engaging with the Department of Education with a view to addressing this long term.</li> <li>The SOLAS FAR 4 Bid had yet to be approved by SOLAS at the time the Service</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Plan was reviewed. This would be similar to previous years.</li> <li>There were certain Youth Services funding streams that had not been allocated at the time the Service Plan was reviewed. It was acknowledged that similar to previous years, it is likely that these funds will be made available later in 2022 and Kerry ETB can apply for same.</li> </ul>
