An Cathaoirleach outline how proud the ETB is to have such a skilled craftsperson training apprentices in the organisation. The outstanding quality of his work is recognised by all. 6.1	Risk Management Update Ms Maria Brennan, Director of OS&D (Chief Risk Officer), and Ms Trisha Tierney, Executive Support, advised the Board of the "Risk-in-Focus 2023 Board Briefing" report, as produced by the European Confederation of Internal Auditors: a copy of which was included in the January 2023 board pack.		
	The report references the 2022 'perfect storms of risks', which presented organisations across Europe and Ireland referring specifically to the ongoing pandemic, the war in Ukraine, supply chain issues/failures, inflation and energy prices. Furthermore, the report sets out five thematic risk areas and top risks facing organisations in 2023, as identified by chief audit executives (details below).		
	Thematic risk areas:		
	Chief audit executives have identified five key areas of focus to help boards navigate these headwinds: geopolitical uncertainty, climate change, organisational culture, cyber and data risk, and digitalisation and artificial intelligence.

	In bringing the report to the Board's attention, it was noted that the Executive would take into account the contents of the report to navigate the 'risky' and uncertain times that lay ahead over the course of 2023. In particular, the team will look at the thematic risk areas and organisational		

risks identified in the context of the ETB's priorities and actions identified in the Service Plan 2023. It was noted that exploring these thematic and organisational risks and their potential impact on Kerry ETB will help the organisation be proactive in addressing same.
In addition, the CEO advised receipt of the "National Risk Assessment Draft List of Strategy Risk 2023," produced by the Government of Ireland. The CEO drew parallels between the risks identified in the European and Irish reports. He outlined that the Executive team would address the "National Risk Assessment Draft List of Strategy Risk 2023" report at the next Senior Executive Management meeting on February 13, 2023.
This update was noted by the Board.
<u>Human capital, diversity and talent management</u> The Board addressed in detail the second risk referenced in the "Risk-in- Focus 2023 Board Briefing" as circulated, i.e., human capital, diversity, and talent management. It was noted that this risk refers specifically to the global and national shortage of people with technical skills/talent, with mature workers retiring and younger people favouring education and alternative career routes.
 In the ensuing discussion, some key points noted were as follows: The CEO advised receipt of the "Report on the Analysis of Skills for Residential Construction & Retrofitting 2023–2030," as commissioned by SOLAS and the Department of Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science. The report, which sets out to quantify the additional construction skills required to deliver the Government's targets in new housing and retrofitting up to 2030, details the significant sectoral gap between the demand and supply of construction skills for housing, retrofitting and general repair.
 Mr Owen O'Donnell, Director of FET, outlined his concerns that the national policy approach to apprenticeships over the past two decades has amplified the skills gap (as mentioned above) as well as a creating a shortage of companies/employers that are willing to appoint and train apprentices.
 Reference was made to the 2008/09 Irish economic recession and the adverse impact this had on new entrants to some of the traditional craft skills sector, i.e. learners since opting out of becoming apprentices due to the perceived volatility of the sector.
 In relation to the recruitment of apprentices, it was clarified that the approach adopted by Kerry ETB's College of FET (Kerry College) is to promote apprenticeship programmes as job opportunities. Concerns were raised about the impact of the adverse social context
for apprentices, particularly the ongoing national debate regarding the exclusion of same from minimum wage legislation.

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	 Reference was also made to the county council schemes for apprentices in the 1990s, which included funded accommodation and meals. The need for the ETB to engage further with its guidance staff and external stakeholders was highlighted. It was noted that guidance staff play a key role in advising students re the array of career options available to school leavers. A more structured approach to Kerry College engaging with guidance in the post-primary curriculum was also suggested, including apprentices visiting schools to share their stories etc.
	 Suggested courses of action included the following: Explore with SOLAS and the Department the possibility of directly recruiting apprentices to ETBs for their first year. Collate a database of potential apprenticeship employers to enhance the process of apprentices finding an employer. Explore capacity to build an entrepreneurial module into the apprenticeship programme that could provide apprentices with the knowledge to establish their own businesses after graduation. The Executive noted these suggestions and advised that a further update would be provided at the February 2023 Board meeting.

National Parks Wildlife Service and Kerry ETB Environmental Education
Memorandum of Understanding
Opening the discussion, the Director of FET provided the following
updates:
Kerry ETB received a letter on October 26, 2022, from the National Parks Wildlife Service (NPWS) notifying of its intention to stand down the long- standing (over two decades) memorandum of understanding (MOU) between both parties, effectively ceasing all Kerry ETB's environmental
education at the Killarney National Park Education Centre. In his letter, NPWS Divisional Manager Mr E M outlined several conditions for this decision, including failure to finalise a new MOU, the shift in delivery by the
Kerry ETB's FET provision since the transition to SOLAS and the levels of education courses and provision since 2020.
Following receipt of this letter from the NPWS, the Director of FET issued a response on November 7, 2022, offering several important clarifications. In his letter to the NPWS, the Director of FET set out that Kerry ETB had unsuccessfully, on numerous occasions, sought meetings with the NPWS to finalise the MOU; the only suspension of services at the education centre was due to COVID-19 restrictions, and Kerry ETB recommenced the delivery of its environmental education as soon as it was in line with government advice. Furthermore, Mr O'Donnell, in his letter, reaffirmed Kerry ETB's commitment to the long-standing MOU and the delivery of the environmental education programmes from Killarney National Park Education Centre. A meeting was sought to clarify any further issues and to
move forward. Both parties met on December 13, 2022, in Muckross House, Killarney,
County Kerry. In attendance for Kerry ETB were:

The Kerry ETB delegation met with the Director General of the Wildlife Park and the divisional and regional managers.
A key outcome of this meeting was the NPWS advising of a national restructuring strategy to consolidate and increase its educational provision. The NPWS had not mentioned this point in their initial correspondence to the Director of FET on October 25, 2022.
Accordingly, the Director of FET requested written confirmation of the NPWS' intention to restructure, which was received on December 20, 2022. In this letter the NPWS set out that it is their plan to resume the management of the Killarney National Park Education Centre in its entirety, formally taking over the centre no later than February 1, 2023.

	The Director of FET agreed to follow up with the NPWS re this matter and a further update will be provided at the next meeting.
	 In the discussion that followed, some key points noted were as follows: Kerry ETB has sourced a rental facility at Muckross road in Killarney to continue its ecology course. A community perception that Kerry ETB FET provision, particularly Kerry College, only delivers courses to adult learners.
	The Board shared its thanks to the Director of FET for his update.

	<u>Finance Update</u> A summary of finances as of December 31, 2023, was presented.
	The Head of Finance drew attention to the increasing level of payments attributed to large scale building projects such as Gaelcholaiste Chiarraí Nua and Listellick National School drawing closer to completion.
	<u>Audit of Annual Financial Statements for 2021 (Matters Arising 4.4)</u> The fieldwork for the audit of the annual financial statement 2021 is ongoing, having commenced on November 28, 2022. The Finance team continue to engage with the auditors' request for additional information.
	The preparation of the 2022 financial statements has commenced and will be submitted to the Department of Education in line with the statutory deadline of April 1.

 <u>Head Office Service Charges</u> An update was provided re this matter, which has been referenced at previous meetings. The Head of Finance advised of correspondence received from the landlord's legal representative on January 10th and 23rd, 2023, respectively, seeking payment of oil, insurance and service charges. The total sought, as per the correspondence, was €159,608.67.
Kerry ETB's legal representative, Murphy Ramsey Walsh Solicitors, responded directly to the landlord on January 24, 2023, addressing this correspondence, setting out that the ETB requires a full breakdown on how these costs were calculated.
A further update will be provided at the next meeting.
<u>Travel and Subsistence Expenditure</u> The Head of Finance advised the Board that the organisation had not met its target to reduce travel and subsistence (T&S) by 50% over 2022 (taking 2019 as the baseline), this reduction being detailed in Goal 1 ('Staff Engagement') of the Kerry ETB Sustainability Strategy. The reduction in travel achieved in 2022 was c. 34%.
In discussing further the 50% target, it was noted that in 2022 there were increases in the rates for T&S and some additional cost incurred from the introduction of new services, for example REALT etc.
Currently, the T&S budgets for 2023 are being finalised, with the 50% target (on 2019 expenditure levels) for reduction remaining in place.
The Board shared its thanks to the Head of Finance for his update.

	 Use of Kerry ETB Seal – Lease of Collis Sandes House, Tralee Kerry College Killarney Campus Building Project (Matters Arising 4.5) Mr Padraig O'Sullivan, Buildings Officer, provided an update on the Gaelcholáiste Nua School building project, which included the following: On December 22, 2022, Kerry ETB received a letter from Dr Avril Behan, SOLAS Director of FET College of the Future, in relation to Kerry ETB's initial approval to progress toward Decision Gate 1 appraisal through the preparation of a preliminary business case under the Public Spending Code. Kerry ETB was advised that workshops will be convened to assist ETBs in developing their business cases, and a schedule of dates is expected imminently. As of the date of the Board meeting (January 31, 2023), no notice of workshops or templates had yet been received by Kerry ETB's Executive. Work on the formal preliminary business case and estates strategy will progress on the receipt of the template documents and guidance notes from SOLAS/DFHERIS. Board Members thanked the Buildings Officer for this update. A further update will be provided at the next meeting.

Gaelcholáiste Chiarraí Nua Building Project (Matters Arising 4.6) As advised at the December 2022 board meeting, the Department of Education (DoE) returned its feedback on the Post Contract Inflation Uplift Report of the €1,373,041.94 (ex VAT) sought in additional costs in the OGP Post Contract Inflation Uplift Report previously submitted to the DoE. The Board noted that the figure of €1,373,041.94 (ex VAT) submitted to the DoE under the OGP Framework related to the anticipated inflationary costs from January 1 st 2022 to project end.
The DoE have initially approved payment to the contractor under the OGP Post Contract Inflation Uplift of \in 779,177.88 (ex VAT) relating to the inflationary costs accrued from January 1 st 2022 up to September 30, 2022 (under the Burden Sharing Principle).
The board were advised that further inflationary payments i.e. for the period after September 30 th 2022, and up to the contract end, will be subject to the monthly application submissions.
On December 19, 2022, Vision Contracting Limited (VCL) issued a letter to Kerry ETB, which invoked Clause 13.1 of the contract between Kerry ETB and VCL. The contractor has referred a claim for perceived increase costs to the Project Board for consideration in line with the Dispute Management Procedure of the contract. The board were advised this claim for increased costs falls outside the scope of the OGP Inflation Co-operation Framework Agreement as outlined above.
The claim has been referred to the Project Board on the following basis:-
 "In regard to the claim for increased costs from March 2021 to December 2021" - No adjustment to the Contract Sum and No Extension of Time (Value of claim €301,759) "Claim for increased costs for other material categories not included within the above- mentioned Framework" - No adjustment to the Contract Sum and No Extension of Time (Value of Claim €255,421)
Extract from letter received from VCL December 19 th 2022.
With Clause 13.1 being invoked, the project board will now meet the week commencing January 30, 2023, to review the submitted claim. Kerry ETB's members of the Project Board are:

The decision of the project board in relation to approval or consideration of payment under the claim will be subject to DoE approval.
It was further noted that VCL remain on target for the handover of the school site in March 2023.

The Board noted this update and welcomed the progress.
<u>Listellick National School (Matters Arising Section 4.7)</u> The handover is provisionally scheduled for February 10, 2023.
Kerry ETB continues to monitor and review progress on site concerning the revised programme.
A further update will be provided at the next meeting.
Lease for Noting: Office 1 and 2, Mulvihill's Pharmacy, Daly's Lane, <u>Killorglin</u> The Board of Kerry ETB, at its meeting on September 27, 2022, approved the lease renewal for Killorglin ABE in respect of Office 1 and 2, Mulvihill's Pharmacy, Daly's Lane, Killorglin to continue the delivery of FET courses,
namely ABE, BTEI and Community Education in Killorglin town.
DFHERIS approved the lease by letter dated January 17, 2023.
Kerry ETB awaits the finalised lease from the landlord before signing and sealing the lease. Kerry ETB is addressing this matter with Murphy Ramsey Walsh (MRW) Solicitors.
This update was noted.
Lease for Noting: Units 3 E, F and G Liber House, Tralee At its meeting on September 27, 2022, the Board approved the lease of Units 3 E, F and G Liber House, Tralee, to enable the ETB to establish an engineering prototyping robotics/mechatronics facility and to create further links for schools and FET opportunities. Subsequently, Kerry ETB was made aware by the proposed landlord that the unit was leased to a third party. This lease to the third party was finalised as the ETB awaited DFHERIS approval of same.
Kerry ETB received DFHERIS approval of the lease on December 23, 2022.
Kerry ETB has informed DFHERIS/SOLAS that the ETB would no longer proceed with the lease by email on January 5, 2023.
This update was noted.
Scamps and Scholars Lease At the November 2022 Board meeting, Kerry ETB approved a lease renewal for Scamps and Scholars (Killorglin Community Childcare). The DoE approved this lease by letter dated January 18, 2023. Kerry ETB has notified MRW Solicitors of the DoE's approval.
It is now understood that the lease is being finalised and will shortly be presented to Scamps and Scholars for signing in the first instance.

<u>#ETB Day 2023</u> Members noted arrangements for #ETBday, which will take place on March 2, 2023, to mark 10 years of education and training boards. ETBI, in conjunction with the ETB sector, has scheduled a series of online and inperson activities from February 27 to March 3, 2023. These activities include a National Learner Competition, National Staff Initiative and Tea Party and ETB Excellence Awards (taking place in Croke Park).
It was noted that the ETB's Directors were currently preparing submissions to the competitions and awards with their leadership teams.

Kerry College Killorglin Outdoor Education and Training Campus Correspondence The Board was briefed on correspondence from Mr H R of the Killorglin Chamber Alliance addressing concerns about the services provided by Kerry College Killorglin Outdoor Education and Training (OETC) Centre. These matters had been addressed with local groups previously by the Director of FET and the Campus Manager.
The CEO advised that he has spoken with Mr H R, and a meeting to address his correspondence will be scheduled.
<u>Master of Business Administration (MBA) Opportunity for Staffing Body</u> The CEO briefed the Board on a proposal seek expressions of interest from across the staffing body, inviting submissions to enrol on a Master of Business Administration (MBA) programme. He advised that proposal plans for six staff to complete the process over a four-year period: three staff to commence in 2023 (first intake) and another three in 2025 (second intake). The programme runs part-time for over two years. The process will be open to all staff.
It was noted that as the organisation grows, it is increasingly important that Kerry ETB engages and invests more in workforce planning, particularly in the context of future planning. This initiative is fully aligned with the provisions of the Kerry ETB Continuous Professional Development Policy.

Members noted and welcomed this update.
Kerry ETB PR Calendar for 2023 Members noted receipt of the drafted Kerry ETB PR Calendar for 2023, as per the meeting slide deck.
In addition to the circulated report, the CEO advised that he has received correspondence from the principal of Moyderwell Mercy Primary School in Tralee requesting that the ETB consider the provision of classrooms (in the old Gaelcholaiste School building) to the primary school during their planned school building programme.
The CEO noted that he would invite the principal to a meeting to discuss same. This request was noted by the Board.
The Board thanked the CEO for his updates.
