It advised its intention to stand down the long-standing memorandum of understanding (MOU) between both parties.</p> <p>In addressing this matter, the Director of FET referenced correspondence between the Director of FET and the NPWS. 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	A meeting was sought to clarify any further issues and to move forward.
<b>Letter December 13, 2022</b>	Both parties meet at Muckcross House, Killarney.  NPWS advises a national restructuring strategy to consolidate and increase its educational provision. <b><u>The NPWS had not mentioned this in their initial correspondence to the Director of FET on October 25, 2022.</u></b>
<b>Letter December 15, 2022</b>	Kerry ETB receives written confirmation of the NPWS' intention to restructure.  NPWS sets out plans to resume the management of the Killarney National Park Education Centre in its entirety, formally taking over the centre no later than February 1, 2023.
<b>Letter January 30, 2023</b>	Director of FET issues correspondence to the NPWS in which he sets out that Kerry ETB understands 'that it is not the intention of the NPWS to progress this long-standing and mutually beneficial collaboration.'
<p>The Director of FET advised the Board that Kerry ETB had subsequently ceased all environmental education provision at the Killarney National Park Education Centre at the request of the NPWS (correspondence dated December 15, 2022). It was noted that Kerry ETB had been instructed by the NPWS to vacate all premises owned by the NPWS by February 1, 2023.</p> <p>Regarding the provision of the programmes to school and staffing of same, the NPWS is taking responsibility going forward. We would very much like to see this transition done soonest in cooperation with Kerry College.</li> </ul> </div> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Figure 1 NPWS Correspondence to Kerry ETB, December 15, 2022</i></p> <p>For the purposes of clarification, the Director of FET advised that to date these staff members had not indicated a preference for move/transfer to NPWS/Killarney National Park Education Centre. This matter may require further engagement with the NPWS, the staff members and their Union representatives.</p> <p>Board members were advised by the CEO that matters re staffing are an executive function and will be addressed by the Executive.</p> <p>The Director of FET also re-affirmed (referenced in the January 2023 Board meeting minutes) to Board Members that Kerry ETB had sourced a rental facility at Muckcross Road in Killarney to continue Kerry College's ecology courses and, therefore, no disruption to delivery has arisen to date.</p> <p>In the discussion that followed, the below key points were noted:</p>	

- All correspondence referenced by the Executive was included in the February 2023 Further Education and Training Report for Board Members to review.
- The NPWS has indicated that as part of its restructuring it will be taking a more direct involvement in the provision of education services, including provision to schools.
- Kerry ETB has recently answered a parliamentary question about this matter.
- The need for continued access to the Killarney National Park for the Kerry College ecology course is very important.
- Schools have been contacting Kerry ETB seeking clarity re the continuation of courses for schools.

Drawing the discussion to a close, it was agreed to issue a letter to the Assistant Secretary at the Department of Arts, Heritage and the Gaeltacht responsible for the NPWS seeking a meeting to clarify matters and address the plans for the continuation of the education programmes for schools etc.

The CEO highlighted the importance of clarifying the provision of the programme in the future for schools.

A further update will be provided at the next Board meeting.

#### Official Launch of the Wind Turbine Maintenance Technician Apprenticeship

In addition to his report, as circulated, the Director of FET outlined to Board Members that the official launch of the Kerry ETB Wind Turbine Maintenance Technician Apprenticeship would take place on March 23, 2023. It was noted that the Minister of State at the Department of Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science, Mr Niall Collins TD, would officiate the launch.

The CEO, in welcoming the formal launch of this important new apprenticeship, advised that invitations to the launch will issue to Board Members.

Board Members noted same.

The Board shared its thanks to the Director of FET for his update.

Kerry ETB Gender Pay Report 2022

The Director of OS&D, Ms Maria Brennan, advised that the Gender Pay Gap Information Act 2021 provides the legislative basis for gender pay gap reporting in Ireland. The regulations in the Act require organisations with over 250 employees to report their gender pay gap publically.

The Director OS&D presented the Board with the Kerry ETB Gender Pay Report 2022, as developed in line with the provisions of the Gender Pay Gap Information Act 2021. It was noted that the report was developed by Kerry ETB in collaboration with Education Shared Business Services (ESBS), ESBS producing the data for the ETB sector.

An overview of the report's results was discussed as follows:

<b>Overall representation</b>	35% male and 65% female
<b>Mean gender pay gap</b>	-11.16%
<b>Median gender pay gap</b>	-5.7%

The results of the report as presented were noted.

These measures include making phishing training and associated materials, i.e. National Cyber Security Centre's Quick Guide to Phishing document, available to staff and learners and issuing regular communications advising of the need to be vigilant.</p> <p>The Board were advised that while steps are being taken to re-enforce controls across these high-risk areas, this area is not without risk.</p> <p>The Board noted this important update.</p> <p><u>Climate Action Update</u>  The Head of CCT provided an update on climate action, which addressed the following (non-exhaustive):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Kerry ETB is currently focused on developing its new Sustainability Strategy (incorporating the Climate Action Plan for 2023-2025),</li> </ul>

A lack of professional, qualified expertise to underpin decisions could give rise to a risk for the organisation.</p> <p>In terms of accessing qualified expertise, Board Members were advised that Kerry ETB is finalising a tender for a contracted service for its sustainability/climate action function. The appointed contractor will work with Kerry ETB to provide expert advice and assurances to deliver on its sustainability/climate action goals across key areas, including climate, energy, waste, and biodiversity.</p> <p>The Head of CCT added that the appointment of this third-party supplier is strategically important to Kerry ETB and, therefore, has been identified as a key objective in the organisation's new Strategy Statement for 2023-2027.</p> <p>The Board agreed fully with the proposed approach to the appointment of this third-party supplier for this key area.</p> <p>An Cathaoirleach thanked the Head of CCT for the updates.</p>

Kerry College Killarney Campus Building Project (*as per Matters Arising 4.5*)

Buildings Officer, Mr Pdraig O’Sullivan, advised Members that no further correspondence from SOLAS/DFHERIS regarding the planned workshops, (as addressed at the January meeting). These workshops are expected to be convened imminently to support ETBs with their preliminary business cases.

Work on the formal preliminary business case and estates strategy will progress upon receipt of the template documents and guidance notes from SOLAS/DFHERIS.

Board Members thanked the Buildings Officer for this update.

Gaelcholáiste Chiarraí Nua Building Project (*as per Matters Arising 4.6*)

A review meeting took place onsite on February 22, 2023, at which all stakeholders reviewed the final programme and schedule for handover. It was noted that Vision Contracting Limited (VCL) remain on target for the

	<p>handover of the school site in March 2023: the school's management planning to commence classes onsite after the Easter Break.</p> <p>The April 2023 Board meeting will take place at the school on April 25, 2023.</p> <p>Board Members were advised that Kerry ETB's project board members continue to engage with VCL in relation to the claim referred to the Project Board by VCL on December 19, 2022 (reference January 31, 2023, Board meeting minutes).</p> <p>The Board noted this update and welcomed the progress.</p> <p>A further update will be provided at the next meeting.</p> <p><u>Listellick National School (as per Matters Arising 4.7)</u>  Kerry ETB achieved handover and practical completion of Listellick National School (NS) on February 16, 2023. The project, on completion, consisted of an 8-classroom primary school with a general-purpose hall, library, and resource rooms across a total of c. 16,400 square feet. The project represents a total investment of c. €6.23 million delivered by Kerry ETB (on behalf of the Listellick NS Board of Management) under a service level agreement (SLA) with the Department of Education (DoE).</p> <p>Addressing the Board, the CEO stated that the handover marked the successful completion of the organisation's first devolved capital project, where Kerry ETB constructed a third-party building under SLA with the DoE. Given the project's significance, the CEO and Director of OS&amp;D shared their appreciation to the CCT team for their work on the project. An Cathaoirleach and Board members concurred with the sentiments expressed.</p> <p>In addition, it was noted that Opperman Associated had been shortlisted for "Building of the Year – Educational" at the Building and Architect of the Year Award 2023 for the design of the building. The winners will be announced at the gala awards in Dublin on April 20, 2023.</p> <p>The Board welcomed this update.</p>
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Lease Renewal for Approval (FET): Ansaldo Block F Monavalley, Tralee  
Board approval was sought for the renewal of the following lease with respect to “Ansaldo,” Block F, Monavalley, Tralee. It was noted that Kerry ETB was unsuccessful in trying to purchase this building in 2021.

Scamps and Scholars Lease

At the November 2022 Board meeting, Kerry ETB approved a lease renewal for Scamps and Scholars (Killorglin Community Childcare), with the DoE approving same by letter dated January 18, 2023.

The Buildings Officer advised that Kerry ETB now awaits the signed lease from Scamps and Scholars (Killorglin Community Childcare). Once received, the signing and sealing of the lease by Kerry ETB will be arranged.

All Board Members noted this update.

A further update will be provided at the next meeting.

Castleisland Community College Dressing Rooms (Added February 27, 2023)

In a letter dated February 7, 2023, Ms Teresa Lonergan, Board of Management (BOM) secretary and Castleisland Community College Principal, advised that her school’s BOM had reviewed Castleisland AFC’s proposal for the development of dressing rooms. The proposal centres on an extension to the current licence agreement for a further 20 years (2023-2043) and the payment by the school of an annual €5,600 fee for the use of the pitch, lights, and dressing rooms (i.e. usage for the full duration of the proposed new 20 year licence agreement). It was noted that the school’s BOM is in agreement with this proposal (reference to February 20, 2023 draft minutes).

The Board were advised that this matters had been addressed at the pitch management committee meeting on January 30, 2023. The pitch management committee is established as per the current licence agreement provisions.

Given the proposal for a new licence agreement, i.e. 20 years from 2023 to 2043, and replacing the existing licence agreement, it was agreed that the new licence agreement need to be drawn up by the respective legal agents for Castleisland AFC's and Kerry ETB. When drafted, the new licence agreement must be issued for review by the Castleisland CC BOM. This matter cannot be progressed further by the ETB Board until receipt of confirmation from Castleisland CC BOM that it is in full agreement with the terms of the proposed new licence agreement.

The Buildings Officer will progress matters as agreed.

A further update will be provide at the March 2023 Board meeting.

The Board noted this update.

Killorglin Community College – Sports Complex (Added February 27, 2023)  
*Please refer to CEO's Report, Section 6.7 for full details.*

Proposed Lease at 9-10 Denny Street (former AIB Business Banking)

Members were advised that Kerry ETB has identified 9-10 Denny Street, Tralee, as a potential property for additional FET and administration accommodation. The property is c. 4,900 square feet and was previously occupied by AIB Business Banking, who are vacating the premises in the near future. Members were advised that if leased by the ETB it could be used to provide additional office space for head office functions (for example the centralised procurement and purchasing function) and additional space for Kerry College, i.e. admissions function, classrooms etc. The Director of FET and Buildings Officer have viewed the building.

The Buildings Officer advised that the former occupants had completed a large-scale fit-out of the offices, making them well-suited for Kerry ETB's needs. By leasing these offices, Kerry ETB can acquire fit-for-purpose accommodation without requiring a costly fit-out of alternative shell and core office space. It was noted that a similar shell and core office space fit-out would cost around €784,000 (€160 per square foot).

An Cathaoirleach queried if this proposed lease would impact on the decisions re securing a permanent head office solution in the future. In response to the query raised, the Buildings Officer confirmed to the Board that the proposed lease terms has a 5-year break clause which the ETB could avail of should it acquire alternative, permanent accommodation. The current Head Office lease expires in 2027.

Additionally, the Director of FET clarified his long-term need for additional space on Denny Street for FET/Kerry College provision.

The proposed lease terms were noted, as follows:

As this matter was presented for consideration only, no decision was made re this matter and it will be considered further at the March 2023 Board meeting.

A business case addressing the rationale for the proposed leasing of this building will be prepared and a visit to review the property is provisionally scheduled for March 1, 2023.

The CEO advised that the future impact of blended working arrangements needs to be considered in assessing any such needs for additional head office space in Tralee.

The Board noted this update.

It was noted that matters are progressing well with the completion of the strategic dialogue sessions with leadership teams (Directorate areas) and the stakeholder consultation process ongoing. The finalised draft strategy will be presented at the May 2023 Board meeting, with the provisional date to launch the new strategy on June 20, 2023.

The Board welcomed this progress.

Over the Water Sports Centre Company Limited by Guarantee (as per Matters Arising Section 4.9)

In addition to his report, as circulated, the CEO advised that there has been no further progress re this matter.

The Board noted this progress.

Head Office Accommodation

Members were advised that the tender process to procure a consultant to complete a building condition report for the Moyderwell, Tralee building ("old" Gaelcholáiste Chiarraí) is complete. This building condition report will be finalised by the end of March 2023.

The findings of this building's condition report will form a part of the overall report being prepared for the Board addressing the possible options for the future of Head Office accommodation (the Board agreed to the ETB's request to produce this report in December 2022).

When completed, this overall report will form the basis for engagement with the Department regarding the long-term head office accommodation.

The CEO advised that with the expansion of services, the need for additional head office space is emerging. However, the impact of decisions re the roll out of blended working arrangements needs to be considered in assessing any such needs for additional head office space in Tralee.

The Board noted this update.

Kerry College Killorglin Outdoor Education and Training Campus Correspondence

As addressed at the January 2023 Board meeting, email correspondence was received on January 6, 2023, from Mr H R, a member of the Killorglin Chamber Alliance. This correspondence addressed concerns about the services provided by Kerry College Killorglin Outdoor Education and Training Centre (OETC).

Previously, these matters had been addressed with local groups by the Director of FET and Kerry College Killorglin Campus Manager, Ms Aodhnait Carroll.

The CEO advised Members that he has spoken with Mr H R. A meeting was scheduled address the correspondence for February 24, 2023 with Mr H R and two colleagues from the Killorglin Chamber Alliance. In attendance for Kerry ETB were the CEO, Director of FET and the Kerry College Killorglin Campus Manager.

The CEO advised that overall the February 24, 2023, meeting was positive and provided an opportunity for all present to address the historical, current and proposed future provision from the centre. In addition, some concerns arising locally re the continuation of services provided by Kerry College's Killorglin Campus to schools and access for the local community to the centre were discussed.

Further to the meeting, the CEO issued an email to Mr H R on February 27, 2023, addressing the following:

- The traditional self-financing model used previously by the centre and how it was overtaken by legislative developments, national pay agreements etc.
- Additional suggestions re community use were welcomed, acknowledging some suggestions as submitted previously by the Killorglin Chamber Alliance.

- The role envisaged for the ETB sector as per the National Outdoor Recreation Strategy 2023-2027.
- The value placed by Kerry ETB on the community's role in the establishment of the centre and the importance of continued good relationships with the community.

The CEO advised that communications with Mr H R, Killorglin Chamber Alliance will continue, focused positively on accommodating community use of the facility.

A further update will be provided at the next meeting.

Killorglin Sports and Leisure Centre Limited by Guarantee

In recent times, concerns were raised at ETB Board level re the permitted use of the Killorglin Sports and Leisure Centre. Specifically, there were concerns regarding permitted use (i.e. use of the building for youth discos).

A meeting took place with representatives of the Killorglin company on February 16, 2023, at which Kerry ETB addressed the following concerns in the context of the lease provisions:

- Permitted use of the building.
- Governance arrangements.
- Land map/boundary

It was noted that the revised lease agreement has been in effect between Kerry ETB and Killorglin Sports and Leisure Centre Limited by Guarantee since December 1, 2019.

Kerry ETB issued a follow-up letter on February 20, 2023, addressing the concerns highlighted (i.e. permitted use, governance arrangements, and land map/boundary).

Kerry ETB received a response from Killorglin Sports and Leisure Centre Limited by Guarantee on February 22, 2023, which positively addressed all the concerns raised. Specifically, the letter set out that the centre will no longer be used for entertainment purposes and no more discos will be held in the centre.

The Board expressed its satisfaction with the progress made in resolving these issues.

The lease includes a provision for Kerry ETB to appoint two nominees to the Board of Killorglin Sports and Leisure Company CLG as per Clause 6.9.1. Members were advised that at present, Ms Fiona O'Brien (Principal Killorglin Community College) and Mr Pdraig O'Sullivan (Buildings Officer) are Kerry ETB's nominees to the Board of Killorglin Sports and Leisure CLG.
