The DoE have sought to confirm the future needs of Coláiste na Ríochta to allow for the development of a master plan of the Coláiste na Ríochta site to include a permanent location for the Gaelscoil Lios Tuathail. Members of the Kerry ETB Corporate, Capital and Technology (CCT) Department met with the Coláiste na Ríochta Principal and Deputy Principal in order to prepare the submission to the DoE. Once a full appraisal of the school's needs is completed it is intended the submission will be issued to the DoE on or before April 9<sup>th</sup> 2021. </li> <li>Kerry ETB, on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2021, received confirmation from the DoE of additional funding of c. €20,000 for the installation of prefabs on the school site. This additional funding was required to provide for essential alterations to the prefabs to ensure the granting of Fire Safety Certificates. It is anticipated that 2 no. Prefab Units will be installed over the Easter Holidays. Design works are underway in relation to two projects to be undertaken under the Emergency Works Scheme at the school during Summer 2021. These works will represent an investment of c. €180,000 for the school. 	The Finance Officer advised that he has been in engagement with Savills the Landlord's representative re the rent review and he provided a detailed update addressing existing passing rent, square footage leased, lease expiry date etc.
	As the ETB and the landlord's expectations re the future rent to be paid are at significant variance, Board approval was sought to enter into to Arbitration to address this matter as provided for in the lease. The Board following discussion approved the ETB to enter into arbitration to address this matter.

	It was noted that the ETB (formerly Kerry Education Services – the VEC in Kerry) has been renting Head Office accommodation for many decades. The need to secure a permanent solution was stressed. The business case for same set out that the Head Office could be relocated to these buildings as part of this acquisition.

	As advised at the February 23 <sup>rd</sup> 2021 Board meeting, Kerry ETB's Business Case (completed property acquisition templates for Block F Industrial Unit (Ansaldo Building), Monavalley Industrial Estate and Unit 1, Listowel Business Development Centre) submissions were presented

<ul> <li>to the Board of SOLAS at their Board meeting on February 11<sup>th</sup> 2021. Feedback was very positive and SOLAS approved the proposal to purchase both buildings. Matters are now referred to the Department for next steps in the process.</li> <li>On February 18<sup>th</sup> 2021 copy of an email was received from Mr Gerry Fitzmaurice, Shannon Commercial Properties (SCP), confirming Block F, Monavalley, Tralee had gone "sale agreed" to a third party.</li> <li>Extracts from email: <ul> <li>"As no final offer was received from KETB by 15<sup>th</sup> January as requested by the selling Agent he was instructed to proceed to "sale agreed" with the highest bid which was unconditional"</li> <li>"I also note that the initial bid received from KETB was subject to vacant possession which Shannon Commercial Properties cannot convey as the existing tenants have legal entitlements to a lease renewal. For this reason, the property was not offered for sale with the benefit of vacant possession"</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Following developments re the proposed acquisition of Block F Industrial Unit (Ansaldo Building), Monavalley Industrial Estate as detailed above, a letter was issued dated March 15 <sup>th</sup> 2021, from MRW Solicitors to Cushman and Wakefield confirming the offer of €470,000 for the building – <i>standalone offer</i> . This offer was subject to contract, to title in the usual manner and to vacant possession.
It was noted that the Listowel building currently has some tenants MRW solicitors are currently clarifying the full extent of same.
Negotiations remain ongoing with SCP.
The Board welcomed this update.
