



Music Generation Kerry Child Safeguarding Statement and Risk Assessment

Music Generation Kerry is a Music Education service providing a range of music education programmes to participants aged from 0 to 18 years old.

In accordance with the requirements of the [Children First Act 2015](#), [Children First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children 2017](#), [the Addendum to Children First \(2019\)](#), the [Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post Primary Schools 2017](#) and [Tusla Guidance on the preparation of Child Safeguarding Statements](#), the Music Generation Committee has agreed the Child Safeguarding Statement set out in this document.

1. Music Generation Kerry has adopted and will implement fully and without modification the Department's Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post Primary Schools 2017 as part of this overall Child Safeguarding Statement
2. The Designated Liaison Person (DLP) is Deirdre Johnson
3. The Deputy Designated Liaison Person (Deputy DLP) is Seamus Whitty
4. The Music Generation Kerry Committee recognises that child protection and welfare considerations permeate all aspects of school life and must be reflected in all of the school's policies, procedures, practices and activities. In its policies, procedures, practices and activities, Music Generation Kerry will adhere to the following principles of best practice in child protection and welfare:

Music Generation Kerry will:

- recognise that the protection and welfare of children is of paramount importance, regardless of all other considerations;
- fully comply with its statutory obligations under the Children First Act 2015 and other relevant legislation relating to the protection and welfare of children;
- fully co-operate with the relevant statutory authorities in relation to child protection and welfare matters;
- adopt safe practices to minimise the possibility of harm or accidents happening to children and protect workers from the necessity to take unnecessary risks that may leave themselves open to accusations of abuse or neglect;
- develop a practice of openness with parents and encourage parental involvement in the education of their children; and
- fully respect confidentiality requirements in dealing with child protection matters.

Music Generation Kerry will also adhere to the above principles in relation to any adult participant with a special vulnerability.

1 The following procedures/measures are in place:

- In relation to any member of staff who is the subject of any investigation (howsoever described) in respect of any act, omission or circumstance in respect of a child attending the school, Music Generation Kerry adheres to the relevant procedures set out in Chapter 7 of the Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post-Primary Schools 2017 and to the relevant agreed disciplinary procedures for Music Generation Kerry staff which are published on the DE website.
- In relation to the selection or recruitment of staff and their suitability to work with children, Music Generation Kerry adheres to the statutory vetting requirements of the [National Vetting Bureau \(Children and Vulnerable Persons\)](#) Acts 2012 to 2016 and to the wider duty of care guidance set out in relevant Garda vetting and recruitment circulars published by the Department of Education and available on the DE website.
- In relation to the provision of information and, where necessary, instruction and training, to staff in respect of the identification of the occurrence of harm (as defined in the 2015 Act) Music Generation Kerry -
 - Has provided each member of staff with a copy of Music Generation Kerry's Child Safeguarding Statement
 - Ensures all new staff are provided with a copy of the Music Generation Kerry's Child Safeguarding Statement
 - Encourages staff to avail of relevant training
 - Encourages committee members to avail of relevant training
 - Music Generation Kerry maintains records of all staff and Committee member training
- In relation to reporting of child protection concerns to Tusla, all Music Generation Kerry personnel are required to adhere to the procedures set out in the Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post-Primary Schools 2017, including in the case of musician educators, those in relation to mandated reporting under the Children First Act 2015.
- The Music Generation Kerry Committee has appointed the abovenamed DLP as the "relevant person" (as defined in the Children First Act 2015) to be the first point of contact in respect Music Generation Kerry's child safeguarding statement.
- All Musician Educators employed by Music Generation Kerry are mandated persons under the Children First Act 2015.
- In accordance with the Children First Act 2015 and the Addendum to Children First (2019), Music Generation Kerry has carried out an assessment of any potential for harm to a child while attending Music Generation programmes or participating in Music Generation activities. A written assessment setting out the areas of risk identified and Music Generation Kerry's procedures for managing those risks is included with the Child Safeguarding Statement.
- The various procedures referred to in this Statement can be accessed via the relevant section on the Kerry ETB website sheets or will be made available on request by Music Generation Kerry.

2 This statement has been published on Kerry ETB's website and has been provided to all members of Music Generation Kerry's personnel and its partner schools and organisations on request. It is readily accessible

to parents and guardians on request. A copy of this Statement will be made available to Tusla and the Department if requested.

- 3 This Child Safeguarding Statement will be reviewed annually or as soon as practicable after there has been a material change in any matter to which this statement refers.

3. The school has the following procedures in place to address the risks of harm identified in this assessment -

In undertaking this risk assessment, the Music Generation Committee has endeavoured to identify as far as possible the risks of harm that are relevant to this school and to ensure that adequate procedures are in place to manage all risks identified. While it is not possible to foresee and remove all risk of harm, Music Generation Kerry has in place the procedures listed in this risk assessment to manage and reduce risk to the greatest possible extent.

Our Child Safeguarding Statement has been developed in line with the requirements of the [Children First Act 2015](#), [Children First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children 2017](#), [the Addendum to Children First \(2019\)](#), the [Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post Primary Schools 2017](#) and [Tusla Guidance on the preparation of Child Safeguarding Statements](#). In addition to the procedures listed in our risk assessment, the following procedures support our intention to safeguard children while they are availing of our service:

- Procedures for the management of allegations of abuse or misconduct against workers/volunteers of a child availing of our service;
- Procedure for the safe recruitment and selection of workers and volunteers to work with children.
- Procedure for provision of and access to child safeguarding training and information, including the identification of the occurrence of harm
- Procedure for the reporting of child protection or welfare concerns to Tusla;
- Procedure for maintaining a list of the persons in the relevant service who are mandated persons;
- Procedure for appointing a relevant person.

All procedures are available on request.

Important Note: It should be noted that risk in the context of this risk assessment is the risk of “harm” as defined in the Children First Act 2015 and not general health and safety risk. The definition of harm is set out in Chapter 4 of the *Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post- Primary Schools 2017*
