4.1	High Court Summons, Pension Proceedings – see Organisation Support and Development Report Section 7.3 from 25 th February Board Meeting The Board was advised that there was no further update currently regarding this matter.		
4.2	Kerry College Killarney Campus Building Project – see Technology, Estates and Sustainability Report Section 7.4 from 1 st May 2025 Board Meeting. Further to the discussion at the ETB Board meeting on 1 st May 2025, matters were progressed as follows: Kerry ETB on 20 th March 2025, supplied the multi-criteria analysis in draft for Solas review prior to making the final submission. Kerry ETB awaits feedback in this regard. Once the feedback is received the final documentation will be formally submitted to Solas.		

Once the site acquisition process has been finalised via the multi-criteria analysis, Kerry ETB will be permitted to engage technical expertise to assist with the refinement and resubmission of the preliminary business case, this process will take c. 6 weeks following completion of the site acquisition process. Kerry ETB will not be permitted to appoint this resource until Solas have reviewed the draft documentation.

The CEO of Kerry ETB issued a letter to the CEO of Solas, Mr. Andrew Brownlee on 12th May 2025. Subsequently, a meeting has been arranged between Kerry ETB and Solas to review Kerry ETB's FET Capital portfolio on 28th May 2025.

A further update will be provided at the next Board meeting on 24th June 2025, as this will be an ongoing process.

Tralee Sports and Leisure Centre Company Limited by Guarantee see Technology, Estates and Sustainability Report, Section 4.4, 1st May 2025 Board Meeting.

The Head of Technology, Estates and Sustainability informed the Board that the Sports Centre Development Committee met on 15th May 2025, priorities were agreed as follows:

- 1. A temporary 150m² gym will be located beside the free weights area.
- 2. Kerry ETB has received a revised QS report noting that the associated costs are c.€550,000 which Kerry ETB have submitted to IPB for approval, with potential completion by Q4 2025.
- 3. Once the final settlement value is received from IPB (expected in 4–6 weeks), Kerry ETB will initiate the tender for the design team.

Kerry ETB is actively seeking to utilise the *Additional Costs of Working* (ACW) provision under its Commercial Combined Insurance Policy to fund the temporary structure on the site, the provisions of this policy allow for the installation and rental of this unit for a two-year period to support the continuity of services at the Tralee Regional Sports and Leisure Centre Limited by Guarantee. Kerry ETB awaits approval from IPB to proceed.

To date Kerry ETB has already received €500k from IPB and is substantiating a second interim payment claim, to a total value of c. €770k which has been spent to date, it is envisaged these funds will be received in the coming weeks. It was noted at the Development Committee meeting that no further ETB funds will be committed until full Phase 1 (Reopening Works) funding is received. Finalisation of the contents claim is underway to support the temporary gym set up.

At the meeting of the Board of Tralee Sports and Leisure Centre Company Limited by Guarantee on 15th May 2025, plans for the temporary gym structure were discussed and the location and approach outlined was agreeable. It was noted that the installation of this temporary gym is central to the recovery of the revenue for the centre at this time.

The Head of Technology, Estates and Sustainability outlined using the map provided in his report for the proposed location of the temporary gym and existing free weights area.

The Board was informed that Kerry ETB wrote to the TRSLC management on May 16th 2025, commending the manger on his excellent stewardship during this crisis, outlining the ongoing support and commitment of Kerry ETB to TRSLC while at the same time clarifying that Kerry ETB has no funding or mechanism to subevent the day-to-day operational costs of the company.

Board members were informed that a Business Plan will be presented at the Kerry ETB Board Meeting on 24th June 2025 by the Chairperson and Manager of Tralee Sports and Leisure Centre. The Business Plan focuses on maintaining centre operations until full restoration is complete.

An Cathaoirleach thanked the Head TES Department for the update.

An Cathaoirleach presented the Board with a letter received from the Kerry ETB Finance Committee in relation to Youth Work funding.

The Chief Executive briefed the Board on the correspondence received and informed the Board that the Youth Work Committee met last week to review the figures given by ETBI.

2. Request matter be included on agenda for planned meeting with Department officials in Summer 2025.

These discussions will be held in the context of there being 10 new UBU sites for selection in 2025. The latest update received advised that the Youth Affairs Unit have delayed issuing the criteria for these sites pending approval from the new Minister.

Board Members welcomed this update.

Blennerville Bakery School - Head of TES Report, Section 7.4, from 1st May 2025 Board meeting.

Following the discussion from the Kerry ETB Board meeting on 1st May 2025, the Director of Further Education and Training informed the Board, that a meeting took place on 22nd May between the CEO of Kerry ETB and the CEO of Kerry County Council where this matter was reviewed.

In advance of this meeting Kerry ETB provided an update to Kerry County Council outlining the following:

- Kerry ETB will not proceed with the lease of the café from Kerry County Council.
- Progress on Kerry ETB Business Case and Capital Submission
- The feedback from instructors and stakeholders regarding the required fit-out and works required to complete a fitout for a bakery school.

The Director of FET informed the Board that, following a recent site visit, it became clear that several aspects of the property had significantly changed since the initial assessment. Notably, the facility could accommodate a maximum of 10 learners with limited storage.

In response, the Director of FET engaged with management to explore alternative uses for the site. Following internal discussions, the CEO met with the Council to propose a change of use for the property—from a bakery school to a Marine Ecology Centre.

The revised proposal is considered highly suitable given the property's location near the sea, a pier, oyster beds, wetlands, and kayaking routes, making it ideal for environmental and marine education. The team believe this shift represents a viable and strategic opportunity with strong educational and ecological value which is adjacent to the Tralee Bay Nature Reserve and Tralee Ship Canal, within a designated Natura 2000 Site.

The site could include a classroom which has considerable potential for a lab facility. Additionally, the cost of fitting out the space for marine ecology purposes would be minimal compared to the substantial capital investment required for the bakery school when Kerry College Tralee already has state of the art kitchen facilities at its Clash campus.

The Board welcomed the update regarding the proposed change in purpose of the space to focus on marine ecology, the CEO expressed satisfaction with this proposal and noted that approximately 20 students will be able to be accommodated in fulltime programmes.

A formal proposal will be developed for submission to Kerry County Council. The team believes this revised project is not only more viable but also aligns with the organisation's goals of innovation and leadership in education and training.

The Board were advised that Kerry County Council are exploring other uses for the Cafe and Kerry ETB is open to provide training supports to the cafe such as barista, waiting etc. if required.

It is hoped that revised lease terms will be presented to the ETB Board for approval on 24th June 2025, as Kerry County Council are on programme to complete the refurbishment by the end of June 2025.

An Cathaoirleach welcomed this update and thanked all involved for their help in progressing the proposal to this point.

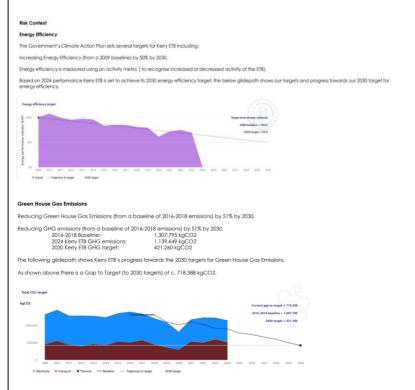

Risk Management update

The Head of Technology, Estates and Sustainability presented the Board with a review of the Corporate Risk Register – Sustainability and Climate Action. Risk number 4.

The risk description was given as follows:

Failure to meet Kerry ETB's requirements as set out in the Public Sector Climate Action mandate, i.e. reduce emissions by 51% and improve energy efficiency to 50% by 2030.

Kerry ETB is actively implementing a suite of risk mitigation measures to meet the Climate Action Plan targets for greenhouse gas emissions reduction and energy efficiency improvements. In 2024, Kerry ETB completed several significant building upgrades, including enhanced heating systems and the installation of Solar PV panels, which will contribute to improved energy performance and reduced emissions. The full impact of these works will be realised in 2025. ➤ The second tranche of the SOLAS Green Devolved Capital Grant (€507,500) is currently being allocated. This funding will further enhance energy efficiency and performance across our educational facilities throughout 2025. > All 12 Kerry ETB Schools have applied for works under the Climate Action Summer Works Scheme, which will support the achievement of national targets from 2026 > In support of these initiatives, Kerry ETB has adopted a comprehensive Climate Action Plan and a Sustainability Strategy, outlining our long-term approach to energy management and sustainability. > Additionally, Kerry ETB has appointed a full-time Grade 6 Officer in the past 12 months, dedicated to driving progress in sustainability and climate action across the organisation. Internal Controls for Head Office/Schools/Centres/Campuses were drafted in 2024 and will be utilised in 2025 Financial Year. ➤ Kerry ETB continues to engage with all relevant stakeholders, including Departments and SEAI to ensure we are in line with the most up to date legislation, circulars, best practice etc. **Proposed: Cllr. The Further Education and Training Report circulated at the meeting, was noted by the Board and taken as read.

The Director of FET proceeded to give the Board an update on the Budget Allocation.

Following a meeting with the National Apprenticeship Office on 13th May 2025, it was reported that apprenticeship programmes are significantly underfunded.

- Apprenticeship Under Funded €1,524,633
- Craft Apprenticeship Under Funded €1,023,277
- Phase 4 & 6 Allowances €790,700 Under Funded

The Director of FET informed the Board that this level of underfunding raises serious concerns around the funding of the apprenticeship provision for 2025. Particular concern relates to the potential cancellation of the September 2025 Phase 4 and Phase 6 intakes, should funding not be secured. He also outlined that this is a national issue and not just Kerry ETB.

Board Members thanked the Director of Further Education and Training for his report and update and also raised concerns regarding the delay and clarity of funding from SOLAS and the National Apprenticeship Office, it was agreed that this needs a lot of focus and attention and that the time element to this is critical.

Procurement: Mr. Michael Larkin McCarthy

Mr. Mc Carthy queried the Executive regarding the procurement approach that Kerry ETB take, specifically whether decisions are based on the lowest price or best value. He advised of a recent issue where the lowest-cost option was selected, but the resulting product was of insufficient quality and not fit for purpose.

In response, the Head of Corporate Procurement clarified that it is lowest price based on the specification outlined.

It was emphasised that all requests should provide a detailed and accurate description, which will ensure that the products procured meet the required standards of quality and are fit for their intended purpose.

Mr. Mc Carthy thanked the Head of Corporate Procurement for her clarification.

Skills Training for TY Students in Coláiste na Sceilge: Cllr. Norma Moriarty

Cllr. Moriarty raised concerns regarding the availability of training and skills development opportunities for Transition Year (TY) students in schools such as Coláiste na Sceilge. Cllr. Moriarty expressed that students in these schools may feel excluded due to their geographical distance from key centres in Tralee. Schools in the Tralee area benefit from easier access to facilities like Kerry College, which enables their students to participate more readily in work experience and other training programmes.

The Director of Further Education and Training (FET) acknowledged the concern and affirmed the commitment to inclusivity. He advised that options will be explored to provide equal opportunities for all students, regardless of their location. This could include identifying suitable courses in Killorglin or the O'Connell Centre, as well as brainstorming additional ideas to ensure that students in more remote areas are not disadvantaged.

Cllr. Moriarty welcomed these suggestions and thanked the Director of Further Education and Training.
